

The tours will be given by Daniel Brucker, Grand Central Terminal's official Ambassador, in gracious co-operation with Metro North Railroad. Mr. Brucker has provided VIP tours for dignitaries, government officials, and historians for 25 years and has appeared on the Discovery Channel, History Channel, National Geographic Channel, Travel Channel, CBS Evening News and the Today Show.

Highlights of this behind the scenes tour include: A visit to New York City's deepest basement with DC generators (which Adolf Hitler tried to have destroyed in 1942), a hidden train station, a 1913 Westinghouse electronic computer, the "war room" on a floor that doesn't exist, the clock tower with the world's largest example of Tiffany glass and the Operations Control Center.

Proper clothing: solid footwear, no high heeled or open toed shoes or sandals. Boots are preferred. Your Hardhat is needed to visit FDR's abandoned rail car. Wear long legged pants and other appropriate clothing for climbing ladders and going on glass cat walks
